## Annual Report 2020-21

Educated women not only tend to promote education of their girl children, but also can provide better guidance to all their children. Keeping this in view, our founder President His Holiness Late Srimanmaharaj Niranjan Jagadguru Dr. Gangadhar Rajayogendra Mahaswamiji of Shree Jagadguru Moorusavirmath, Hubballi established Shree Jagadguru Moorusavirmath Vidyavardhaka Sangha (SJMVS) at Hubballi in the year 1966. He established the SJMVS Arts and Commerce College for Women in 1967 at Hubballi.

It is noted as one of the oldest and most vibrant colleges for women. The college is well situated in the heart of the city, easily accessible to all transport links. Since its inception in 1967, the college has been in the forefront in the field of higher education. The main objective of the college is to provide holistic education to young women hailing from different social spectra and thereby enabling them to carve a niche for themselves in society.

The college is affiliated to the Karnataka State Akkamahadevi Women's University Vijayapura. In its 54 years of glorious history, the college has achieved many milestones.

The college has also to its credit the rare distinction of being accredited with "A" Grade by NAAC three times i.e. in 2004, 2010 and 2016. The college also has the honour of being bestowed with the status of College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) by UGC during the XI & XII plan period. The college has the necessary infrastructure to facilitate meaningful teaching & learning. It has a three-storeyed building with well maintained classrooms, well equipped laboratories in Psychology, Computer, Hindustani Music, Language Lab, Smart Boards, LCD's, OHP's wi-fi connectivity and other audio-visual aids to promote effective learning. Apart from this the college has a lift facility, reprographic facility, fax, CCTV surveillance.

The Institute started with 167 students but during the academic year 2020-21 it has grown proudly having **993** (B.A-262, B.Com-664, M.Com:-48, M.Music:19) students who are now gaining access to value added education. 256 students have enrolled themselves for BA, 648 for B.Com, 61 for M.com and 19 for M.Music. The

college has 2 UG programs (BA&B.Com) and 2 PG programs Commerce (M.com) and Hindustani Music (M.Music)

The total number of subjects taught in the Arts and Commerce are 14. There are 14 assistant professors and 30 management appointed teaching faculty among whom 9 of them hold PhD degree. 18 non-teaching staff are employed in the institute.

### **Academic Achievements**

In M.Com Miss. Aishwarya Hegde bagged a gold medal in Corporate Accounting subject with 82.5% and Miss. P. Kavya of M.Music II year stood first and bagged gold medal for securing highest marks in Hindustani Music.

### **Co-Curricular Activities**

Apart from delivering curriculum, the college also organises a number of Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Due to the pandemic situation, students were encouraged to attend online classes, special talks and were motivated to submit their assignment through online mode.

All the faculty are constantly striving to develop a competitive spirit among the students by organising special programs such as Workshops, seminars Guest Lectures and various other competitions.

### **Faculty achievements**

4 teaching faculty are serving as BOE and BOS members of Karnataka State Akkamahadevi Women's University, Vijayapura. Dr. G. H. Kallimath is acting as a mentor and is a guide for Ph.D scholars. Dr. Jyothilaxmi.D.P is a guide for the Ph.D scholars of Kannada University Hampi. Dr.Cecilia D.Cruz, assistant professor of English, Dr. G. S. Navalgund, assistant professor of Kannada, Dr. Mahadevappa Harijan, assistant professor of Political science, Prof. Ashwini Indargi, assistant professor of Commerce have published the Research articles in Journals. And a book is published by Dr. G.S. Navalagund. Faculty have participated and presented research papers in national and state level seminars held at various Universities.

### **Library**

During the academic year 2020-2021 we have purchased total number of 991 books of different subjects with 59 Volumes, 9 newspapers and 15 Periodicals facility which is available in Kannada, English and Hindi. The college has a resourceful library with an excellent collection of 55,310 books, 23,432, volumes,15 periodicals and 9 daily newspapers, Inlibnet N-List Access , online journals, shodhasindu, **House/remote access to e-publications** available through In libnet Consortia and reprographic facility for users, Audio -visual facility . Open Access System facility in the Library for students to read books to suit their tastes in their leisure time has been launched

The library is fully automated with bar coding facility. Library has OPAC with advanced search facility and digital library facility.1 set of books (6books) is issued to

the students for whole semester and one reference book is issued on borrowers card once in every 15 days. The library also provides subject-wise yearly question paper for students reference. Library staff provides reminders to the students and staff members about library deposits (i.e books, journals, magazines or CD/DVD).

The office is fully computerized with accounting, e-admin and e-governance software packages installed. Dr. Moojagam auditorium is built for literary and Cultural activities throughout the year there is a sports room equipped with sports materials for indoor games its also has a 12 station multi-gym.

During the academic year 2020-21, 400 Students have availed scholarship facility of the Government of Karnataka through SSP Portal .The government credits the scholarship amount directly to the students bank account. Students belonging to OBC/SC/ST and minority categories have applied for scholarships.

### **Extra-Curricular Activities**

Students Welfare Department, and Anti-ragging cell, Debate Union, Arts Circle, Extension Activities Department, Women's Empowerment and Anti- sexual Harassment cell, Human Resources Department and Alumni Associations have organized many programs throughout the year to promote training and encouragement for students over all development. As a result of this our students have the opportunity to develop intellectually and physically.
